NEW SOLUTIONS FOR PROSTATE PATIENT CARE

The Urology Group has introduced two new high tech solutions to provide additional options for prostate patient care: MRI-guided biopsies and UroLift.

MRI-Guided Biopsies

The Urology Group has partnered with ProScan Imaging to provide magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) technology for men at a high risk for aggressive forms of prostate cancer. An MRI session at ProScan provides images of the patient's prostate, which are superimposed over a 3D ultrasound scan at The Urology Group. As a result, physicians can use the combined image like an anatomical map to target the areas to biopsy. The technology provides a better, more comprehensive view of the prostate to reveal suspicious areas.

Urolift

For men suffering from the effects of an enlarged prostate, the UroLift System provides a treatment alternative to drug therapy or more invasive surgery. With UroLift, permanent implants are inserted during a minimally-invasive procedure and act like window curtain tie-backs to hold the lobes of the enlarged prostate open. The procedure does not require any cutting, heating or removal of prostate tissue. UroLift provides fast and meaningful relief from the discomfort and urination problems caused by an enlarged prostate, improving the overall quality of life for patients.

With these two significant additions, The Urology Group continues to build on its national reputation for prostate care, incorporating new medical knowledge and technological advancements to provide the best diagnostic testing and solutions.

ZIKA VIRUS: A THREAT TO WOMEN AND MEN

The news media has reported that the Zika virus has now reached the U.S., with dozens of cases recently diagnosed in Florida. Previously contained to areas like Mexico and the Caribbean, the mosquito-borne virus has prompted worldwide concern because of its rapid spread and link to birth defects.

There's a dangerous misconception that only pregnant women need to be concerned, but Zika is a men's health issue as well. As long as a woman isn't pregnant when she's infected, or becomes pregnant shortly afterward, she doesn't run the risk of passing along a Zika-related birth defect.

However, Zika has been found in the semen of infected men. Reproductively speaking, men – not women – have the most reason for concern.

That's because Zika can persist in semen for at least two months – meaning a man could still pass the virus to a sexual partner. The symptoms are deceptively mild, and could include a slight fever, skin rash, muscle and joint pain, and conjunctivitis, and normally last from two days to a week. The virus can be detected through a blood test.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that men showing any symptoms should wait six months before having unprotected sex. Those who have been exposed to the Zika virus should use condoms or avoid sex all together. There is currently no vaccine to prevent or medicine to treat the Zika virus.
