FINDING FULFILLMENT BEYOND THE BLUE PILL



More than 20 million men in the U.S. experience erectile dysfunction, whether a result of age, an injury or the after-effects of prostate cancer treatment.

Some men get help with prescription pills; however, many feel that "the blue pill" takes away a bit of spontaneity. Still, others who experience chronic erectile dysfunction simply find medication ineffective.

Unfortunately, too many men give up at this stage and forego the type of intimate relationships they used to have. In such cases, a surgically implanted penile prosthesis can provide a natural-feeling erection that does not require pills or planning.

Penile implantation is a common procedure that has been practiced and improved upon for years. There are two types:

- Malleable: This device consists of two bendable rods, placed inside the penis, that produce a consistent, semi-rigid feel. The man just moves his penis into the erect position to engage in sex.
- Inflatable: This system is custom-fit and relies on a small, implanted pump that delivers a natural-looking and -performing erection. Like the malleable insert, it is not visible and therefore not noticeable to a partner, but it does offer more control.

Importantly, men can enjoy a natural climax with either device. Learning whether it is the right treatment, however, starts by talking with a urologist.

BOTOX FOR OVERACTIVE BLADDER: RELAXING TREATMENT FOR A COMMON CONCERN

We often think of Botox as a cosmetic procedure, but it also can treat a common internal condition that could lead to wrinkled brows – overactive bladder. Because the drug relaxes muscles, Botox has proven effective in treating OAB and other urinary issues, including incontinence.

The process is fairly non-invasive. The physician injects Botox into the bladder muscle using a tiny camera, inserted through the urethra, as a guide. This procedure is called a cystoscopy. Here's how Botox works:

- Once applied, the drug calms the muscle so the bladder can store more urine.
- At the same time, the bladder maintains enough control to be emptied voluntarily.
- This results in fewer trips to the bathroom and reduced leakage.

Botox applications typically last about nine months. Longer-lasting treatments include sacral nerve stimulation, or InterStim therapy, in which a small pacemaker-like device is implanted near the tailbone to stimulate the nerves that control bladder function.

A physician can help determine the best treatment for a relieving outcome.
