- Men's Sexual Health We are helping thousands of men recover their confidence and vitality using advanced treatment options from minimally invasive ultrasound wave therapy to surgery.
- **CyberKnife** An accurate, cost-effective, and more convenient form of radiation treatment for prostate cancer, which is only offered by The Urology Group in our region.
- Robotic Surgery We continue to be the clear market leader in urological robotic surgery in our region.
- Clinical Research Our team conducts clinical trials of new therapies for urologic conditions, providing the community access to emerging cutting-edge treatments.

An enormous part of our success has been our ability to continuously network with physicians across the U.S. who share our vision. Last year, we founded Solaris Health, an innovative company that allows us to partner with other independent urology practices across the country in order to share groundbreaking resources, technology, and research.

HISTORIC COMMITMENT TO PATIENT CARE



HISTORY & VALUES

In the 1980s and '90s, physicians across the country were finding it difficult to provide the level of patient care they wanted. At the time, most specialty physicians managed their own practices or joined small groups. But market forces, ranging from rising equipment expenses to increasingly complex government regulations, required physicians to spend more time and resources managing the business and less time treating patients.

The founding physicians of The Urology Group assessed the direction of the healthcare industry and decided to pursue a different path. A loose affiliation of seven urology group practices initially came together in 1994 to share resources and administrative services. The member physicians began seeing benefits almost immediately, and in 1996 they transformed the original arrangement into an integrated group medical practice of 23 physicians, now known as The Urology Group.

From a business perspective, the agreement enabled access to coordinated professional services including finance, operations, information technology, and human resources. The combination of physicians and patients also provided strength in numbers, lowering administrative costs and increasing negotiating power with vendors and insurers. With operational functions effectively managed, the physicians and medical staff could concentrate on providing top quality patient care through the standardization of best practices and a focus on urologic subspecialization.

BUILDING SUCCESS

The progressive growth and development of The Urology Group's corporate facilities reflect the organization's ongoing success.


The first corporate office opened in 1996 on Wesley Avenue in Norwood. Rapid expansion and the addition of an ambulatory surgery center necessitated a move to a larger, custom-renovated space on Norwood's Smith Road in August of 1998. To operate the ambulatory surgery center, the member physicians formed a separate company, The Urology Center, LLC.

Over the next decade, as The Urology Group continued to evolve, the need for a free-standing facility became evident. To better serve an increasing number of patients, the organization needed a space that would accommodate new technology, additional physician offices, and more parking. Having been in Norwood since 1996, The Urology Group wanted to remain in this centrally located area, which had proven convenient for patients across its base.

The preferred location, on Joseph E. Sanker Boulevard, offered accessibility to the Norwood Lateral, ample space for surface parking, and proximity to neighboring businesses for the convenience of staff and patients.

The Urology Group purchased the property in 2009. Through an innovative design, the former brownfield transformed into an attractive, high tech, LEED certified facility. The new location, known as the Norwood Campus, opened in August of 2012.

In 2020, The Urology Group became a founding member of Solaris Health, a national platform designed to enhance access to independent specialty healthcare.

Today, the Norwood Campus combines state-of-theart equipment with a complete suite of urological health services all under one roof – serving as the hub for the network of physicians across the region. The 55,000-square-foot facility is home to the expanded ambulatory surgery center; an in-house laboratory specializing in urologic pathology; an imaging center; and the CyberKnife suite, which offers advanced radiation treatment for prostate cancer and is the only center of its kind in the region.

The Norwood Campus has become a local landmark, visible to thousands of commuters passing on the Norwood Lateral on a daily basis. The building also led commercial development in the immediate area, as additional businesses have subsequently built on nearby properties, further enhancing the neighborhood.

The Norwood Campus represents The Urology Group's position in the community: a highly specialized, affordable, and convenient healthcare resource for patients across Greater Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky, and Southeastern Indiana.







THE UROLOGY GROUP TODAY

SUPERIOR CARE THROUGH SPECIALIZATION

SPECIALIZED SERVICES

The Urology Group has earned its reputation for superior care by maintaining a highly trained medical staff, providing advanced treatment options, and placing patients first.

The collective experience of our physicians, technicians, and medical staff offers a breadth and depth of specialization unmatched in the region for conditions involving the bladder, kidneys, prostate, and urinary tract and reproductive tract.

PROSTATE CANCER

Through enhanced facilities, technology, training, and patient education, The Urology Group has established itself as the premier provider of prostate cancer care in the region, treating more than 71% of the cases in Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky. After a prostate cancer diagnosis, patients receive in-depth support to evaluate options and determine the best course of action, whether it's pharmaceutical, radiological, surgical, or active surveillance (close monitoring without immediate treatment).

The Advanced Prostate Cancer Clinic assists patients when the disease has spread beyond the prostate. A nurse navigator identifies patients and assigns them to one of The Urology Group's on-staff physicians who specialize in advanced prostate cancer. Enhanced treatment options, including clinical trials, are designed to extend and enhance the quality of life for patients.


OTHER CANCERS

As physicians with a deep and constant focus on the urinary tract, we offer patients who face a variety of cancers the best treatment options for treating their conditions. Whether it's to address testicular, kidney, or bladder cancer, we have invested in technology, research, and training to stay on the cutting-edge of treatment.

MEN'S WELLNESS CENTER

In 2021, we created the Men's Wellness Center. It is a confidential, caring approach to treating men's sexual health issues. Men can experience sexual health issues at any time, although some conditions become more prevalent with age. We are helping thousands of men recover their confidence and vitality using the least invasive and most advanced treatment options available.

- Ultrasound wave therapy is a painless, non-invasive technology to stimulate penile blood flow and restore natural sexual performance.
- Testosterone supplements, compounded specifically for each man's individual needs, can help treat changes in sexual function, physical, or emotional health associated with Low T levels.
- For men with erectile dysfunction who do not respond to medications or other treatments, penile surgical implants may be the right option.



FEMALE PELVIC MEDICINE

Although a urologist can be perceived as a "man's doctor," in fact women are more likely than men to experience conditions such as incontinence, overactive bladder, interstitial cystitis, and urinary tract infections.

While women can receive treatment from any urologist, The Urology Group has three physicians specially certified in Female Pelvic Medicine & Reconstructive Surgery by the American Board of Urology.

This specialization in female urology includes potential treatments that cover a range of patient needs:

- lifestyle changes, such as diet and exercise
- pharmaceutical or natural remedies
- physical therapy and pain management
- surgical options

KIDNEY STONE CARE

Approximately one in seven adults will suffer the pain of kidney stones at some point in their lives – and for thousands of people each year, The Urology Group offers relief.

Options for kidney stones include lithotripsy, which uses high-energy shock waves to break up the stones. Lithotripsy treatments are performed more often at the Norwood Campus than any facility in the country, with nearly 1,500 procedures completed annually.

Ureteroscopy, another alternative for kidney stone care, involves the insertion of a thin, telescopic instrument into the urinary tract. Most surgeons use a laser to break up stones, which patients can then successfully pass. The treatment has an outstanding success rate and typically gets completed on an outpatient basis.

The Urology Group also provides specialists who can work with patients to design a program to prevent kidney stones in the future.

BENIGN PROSTATIC HYPERPLASIA (BPH)

With more than half of men in the U.S. over the age of 51 facing BPH, we continue to focus on this condition that has an impact on quality of life.

After lifestyle changes and medications have been tried, The Urology Group offers patients who still need help a variety of minimally invasive procedures that can provide long-term solutions. These include the UroLift® System, GreenLight™ Laser Therapy, and updated approaches for Transurethral Resection of the Prostate (TURP), the traditional "gold standard" treatment.

We are some of the only experts in the region who perform Holmium Laser Enucleation of the Prostate (HoLEP) laser treatment. This specialization is unique in our region.

BLADDER CONTROL

Conditions such as overactive bladder and incontinence cause embarrassment and significantly impact the patient's lifestyle. In the past, treatments typically focused on medications, but that approach does not always provide long-term solutions. The Urology Group instead takes a holistic approach, considering many factors in order to give bladder patients their quality of life back.

The Urology Group provides advanced options to identify and treat the issue. Urodynamics diagnostic testing, completed in the surgery center, helps assess the condition of the bladder. From there, pelvic floor physical therapy can be prescribed, such as biofeedback to retrain pelvic floor muscles or Kegel exercises to strengthen muscle groups. Surgical treatments include conventional bladder suspension surgery; Botox® injections into the bladder, which relax the muscle and give patients more control and less incontinence; and InterStim® therapy, in which a tiny pacemaker-like device is implanted in the lower back to calm the nerves that control bladder function.







INNOVATION & TECHNOLOGY

Advanced medical technology provides the tools to transform lives. The Urology Group believes in the power of technology and constantly monitors and evaluates the latest cutting-edge developments in healthcare.

But technology alone – without the human touch – does not serve the patient best.

The Urology Group invests significantly in equipment and resources in order to offer the highest quality care that optimizes the patient experience and results.

ADVANCED UTI TESTING BASED ON DNA

Urinary tract infections may be common, requiring more than 8 million people to seek medical attention a year. Yet sometimes, the cause of the infection – bacteria in the urine – is difficult to diagnose, particularly among older women.

To tackle this issue, The Urology Group in 2019 added molecular microbiology to its suite of diagnostic options. The test is a urine study designed expressly to identify hard-to-detect UTIs.

This is accomplished through a two-part DNA scan that seeks out bacteria and fungi separate from traditional urine cultures:

- **Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) processing:** This is an expedient method for copying small segments of DNA in great numbers. Some call it "molecular photocopying."
- Next generation sequencing: This large-scale technology can reveal, in a single run, the DNA sequencing of a complete bacterial genome (the set of genes in an organism).

The DNA extracted from the urine sample is examined for signs of more than 50,000 bacteria and fungi in MicroGen's database.

The result: Patients can be treated faster and enjoy life in comfort.

Through our on-site lab as well as partnerships with other labs, we are working on cutting-edge analyses that serve to dramatically improve outcomes for patients.

GENETIC TESTING FOR CANCER

Medical scientists have recently confirmed a family link between prostate cancer and other cancers, particularly breast, ovarian, pancreatic, and colon cancers.

We now understand that men who develop aggressive prostate cancer should undergo genetic testing to look for an inherited gene mutations that not only could affect their care, but may affect their children's risk of cancer.

For example, if Dad tests positive for mutations of the Breast Cancer 1 or 2 genes (BRCA-1, BRCA-2), he should urge daughters and sons to test for the same mutation. There is a 50% chance that a father who has prostate cancer and carries one of these genetic mutations will pass the mutation on to his offspring.

The Urology Group's genetic testing service is called Precision GU. Genetic testing and counseling helps predict patients' risk for a variety of diseases and whether their children may inherit this risk. The benefit is early detection and targeted medical intervention.

URAC ACCREDITATION AND COMPOUNDING CAPABILITIES MAKE PHARMACY UNIQUE IN REGION

In 2020, The Urology Group's pharmacy earned national accreditation from URAC, the leading independent nonprofit organization, which uses evidence-based measures and develops standards to improve the quality of healthcare. Our group's specialty pharmacy was recognized for elevated standards and continued innovation.

"This seal of approval from the URAC reflects the quality commitment that The Urology Group brings to every aspect of care provided to our patients," said Dr. Gary Kirsh M.D., president of The Urology Group "The hard-earned accreditation is another example of The Urology Group's effort to deliver on healthcare value for our patients."

Additionally, in 2020 we added compounding capabilities to our in-house pharmacy, which means we can create customized drugs that are not commercially available. The move aimed to resolve two common patient frustrations: cost and exact dosage.

In the case of treating low testosterone, for example, it is essential to find the correct formulation that helps men get back to their personal "normal." Through compounding we can adjust doses and formulations to ensure patients are experiencing maximum therapeutic benefits from the therapy without any harmful side effects.

Our pharmacy offers competitively priced drugs for patients who have limited insurance, often at a more affordable price than commercial pharmacies. By collaborating with our physicians, our pharmacy helps develop the customized treatment plans for our patients.

CYBERKNIFE SBRT FOR PROSTATE CANCER

The first of its kind in the region, CyberKnife SBRT (stereotactic body radiation therapy) works without incisions, delivering high doses of radiation in pencil thin beams from a moving robotic

arm. The Urology Group was the first provider in the nation to use CyberKnife exclusively for prostate cancer when it was installed in November 2013.

CyberKnife allows patients to complete treatments in just five sessions, compared to 40 or more for traditional radiation therapy. Patients experience minimal side effects with many returning to work or their routine schedules on the same day.

Radiation oncologists specializing in CyberKnife technology work in concert with each patient's urologist as part of a team-oriented approach to treatment. And by incorporating this innovative technology, The Urology Group reinforces its position as the leading provider of prostate cancer treatment in the region.

LITHOTRIPSY WITH ULTRASOUND

At the Norwood Campus, The Urology Group performs more lithotripsy procedures than any other location in the country. Lithotripsy (also called extra-corporal shock wave lithotripsy, or ESWL) uses high-energy shock waves to break kidney stones into tiny pieces, making them small enough to pass through the urinary tract and out of the body.

The Urology Group offers the unique advantage of 'built in' ultrasound with lithotripsy – one of the only providers in the nation to do so. With this advanced system, the type and location of kidney stones get pinpointed more easily to better target stones and minimize the impact on surrounding tissue. As a result, the stone breakage rate improves, which increases the effectiveness of the treatment.

UROLOGIC OUTPATIENT SURGERY CENTER

With nearly 15,000 surgeries performed annually, The Urology Center at the Norwood Campus is the highest volume urology-only facility in the country. The Gold Seal of Approval from The Joint Commission certifies that the surgery center performs at the industry's highest levels for patient care and quality facilities.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Since its inception, The Urology Group and its employees have invested significant time and resources to make the community a better place in which to live, work, and raise a family. The organization emphasizes that commitment in its core values: "Give back to our communities to improve lives."

Connecting with the community ensures a vibrant, engaged, mutually beneficial relationship for employees, patients, and neighbors.

5K/10K RACE FOR PROSTATE CANCER

Since 2006, The Urology Group's highest-profile charity event, the annual ZERO Prostate Cancer 5k/10k has attracted nearly 2,000 participants each September. Although in 2020 and 2021 the COVID pandemic interrupted our plans for our annual prostate cancer run, we hope to be back supporting this great cause in 2022.

The idea for the race began with two nurses who worked in the surgery center. Reflecting the organizational values, they wanted to establish an event that showed support for prostate cancer patients and their families. That first race in 2007 drew about 100 runners with proceeds going toward local cancer-related charities.

In 2011, The Urology Group aligned with ZERO Prostate Cancer, a national nonprofit organization dedicated to raising funds and awareness for prostate cancer. With ZERO on board, the race gained access to new resources that helped take it to a new level, driving attendance near 1,000 for the first the number reached nearly 2,000 people either running, volunteering, or attending the morning's festivities, becoming the second-largest event of its kind in the nation.

Over the past 15 years, the event has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars to support prostate cancer research and awareness. The race remains the organization's largest opportunity for employees to volunteer and connect with the community.

CELEBRATING VETERANS AND THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS

The Urology Group has a history of saluting U.S. veterans for their service.

In 2018, we sponsored an event honoring local veterans to commemorate the 65th anniversary of the Korean Armistice Agreement. The event, held at the General Electric headquarters in Evendale, Ohio, drew a crowd of more than 75 veterans, plus their guests, as well as national media attention.

We held similar veteran events in 2016, marketing the 75th anniversary of Pearl Harbor, and in 2015, commemorating the 70th anniversary of V-E (Victory in Europe) Day.









MAKING AN IMPACT COLLECTIVELY – AND INDIVIDUALLY

In addition to corporate sponsorships, employees of The Urology Group make an impact in their communities in a variety of ways. Whether coaching a youth sports team, stocking a local food pantry, or helping with neighborhood cleanup efforts, employees devote thousands of hours annually to helping charity groups as well as their neighbors.

Prostate Cancer Screenings

Physicians and medical personnel donate many hours each year to providing free prostate cancer screenings for men. These tests can provide the initial indication of prostate cancer, and early detection means more options for treatment and an increased chance of survival.


